Costs

- \$ 135 per Scout without a parent volunteer
- \$ 110 per Scout with a parent volunteering 3-4 days (Save \$25 - One discount per parent)
- \$ 95 per Scout with a parent volunteering 5 days (Save \$40 - One discount per parent_
- \$ 35 1st junior camper from a family
- \$ 25 2nd or more Junior Camper from the same family
- \$ 25 All Cub Scout or Junior Campers from a single family with two Cub Scout Campers are registered
- \$ 10 Extra camp t-shirt (Volunteers must volunteer at least 3 days to receive a free camp shirt.)

Attendance Details

- Cub Scout Campers must be registered Cub Scouts in the Baltimore Area Council.
- Non-Scouts, except Junior Campers, may not attend Day Camp.
- There are no discounts for parents volunteering less than 3 days.
- One parent volunteering for a full week earns 1 full week discount for one Scout.
- Two parents splitting a week of volunteering for a total of 3-4 days will earn one 3-4 day discount for 1 Scout.
- Two parents splitting a week of volunteering for a total of 5-8 days will earn 1 full week discount for 1 Scout.
- Scouts, Junior Campers and parents earning discounts must all be from the same family.
- Every Tiger Cub must be accompanied by one full time parent volunteer working in the same den.
- Purchasing a second T-Shirt to avoid washing a single shirt every night is strongly recommended.
- If, for any reason, a parent is unable to volunteer on a day they are committed to, and missing that day would reduce or eliminate the amount of the discount earned for their Scout, the parent must repay the amount of the discount given. If payment is not received by the end of the week, the parent's Pack will be billed directly by BAC for the amount owed.

Scout Volunteers

Registered Scouts are needed to work as volunteer Den Chiefs and station assistants. All volunteer Scouts must meet all of the following criteria:

- All male volunteers must be registered Boy Scouts in the Baltimore Area Council.
- All male volunteers must have achieved at least the rank of first Class in Boy Scouts.
- Male volunteers 11-13 years old must work with a parent volunteer in a Tiger or Wolf den in order to maximize the age difference between the campers and the Scout volunteer.
- All female volunteers at least 14 years old must be Baltimore Area Council Venturing Crew members and may assist at any Day Camp station or activity or as a Den Chief.

- Female volunteers 11-13 years old must have a parent volunteer on site and will be assigned to assist with the Junior Camper program.
- Age and rank criteria are waived for Boy Scouts and female volunteers who volunteered at the 2011 Day Camp.
- Males who are not Boy Scouts may not volunteer at Day Camp.
- All youth volunteers MUST attend a 2 hour camp training session in the spring, time and date TBD.

Food

- Each camper must bring a bag lunch and a drink every day. Coolers for daytime storage will be provided by the den leaders.
- Campers must bring a water bottle to carry with them at camp. Water will be available at every camp station and at the administration tent at all times.
- Drinks and snacks will be available for purchase at the camp Trading Post.

Clothing

- Every 3, 4 and 5 day volunteer and all Den Chiefs will receive one free camp t-shirt. The shirt is a visible security measure, MUST be worn every day, and may NOT be altered in any way. Purchasing a second t-Shirt to avoid washing a single shirt every night is strongly recommended.
- Every 3, 4 and 5 day volunteer and all Den Chiefs will receive one free camp hat. The hat provides sun protection and must be worn every day.
- Closed toe shoes, such as sneakers or hiking boots, and socks are required. Open toed shoes, wheelies and crocs are prohibited. Campers who arrive at camp without appropriate shoes, or without socks, may not participate in the program and must wait at Admin until a parent brings appropriate footwear to camp.

Junior Campers

- Junior Campers MUST have a parent volunteering on site at all times.
- Junior Campers MUST be potty trained, no exceptions.
- Junior Campers have their own, age appropriate, program. They do not participate in the same activities as the Cub Scouts. Junior Campers DO participate in the Wednesday evening family program.

Refunds

Full refunds of registration fees are available until May 1st. After May 1st, refunds are available ONLY at the discretion of the Day Camp Program Director.

Adult Volunteer Youth Protection Training

Parents need not be registered with BSA in order to volunteer at Day Camp. However, ALL adults volunteering at Day Camp MUST provide proof of Youth Protection Training. A copy of a Youth Protection Certificate, with an expiration date after the end of Day Camp, must be provided with each adult volunteer registration form. Registration forms not accompanied by a Youth Protection Certificate will not be accepted by the registrar. Late fees will apply if a registration is rejected and not resubmitted before the on-time registration deadline.

Discipline

Discipline at Day Camp will be handled by the Camp Director on an individual basis depending on the problem and circumstance. If the problem or action is a serious or dangerous issue a Parent will be contacted immediately and the Scout will be asked to leave camp. The safety and security of every Day Camp participant is our priority.
